Free Virus Scanning and Spam Filtering Included in all Scatter Creek InfoNet Accounts

Scatter Creek InfoNet scans all incoming and outgoing mail for viruses. This service is provided free of charge for all Scatter Creek InfoNet customers. The virus database is updated daily. This filter is meant to complement, but not replace, the virus protection software you are currently running as it does not scan for viruses that may come through other sources such as web browsing. Spam filtering is another service provided free of charge. The filter identifies "Spam" and filters it out before you receive it. 705232

Q: I was told that if I signed up for DSL service, I could talk on the phone and surf the net at the same time. How is this possible?

A: Your telephone line can be broken down into several "sections." When you talk on the telephone, you are only using about a fourth of the "sections" available. A DSL modem uses some of the other available "sections" that are not being used when you talk on the telephone. Therefore, your internet connection and your voice never cross paths. A regular dial-up modem, on the other hand, uses the exact same "sections" that you use when you talk on the telephone and the two cannot work simultaneously.
